Deuteronomy 30

Verses 1-5

- What things would come upon them? Do you remember from yesterday?
- Where will they be when they remember these things?
- What will God do when he gathers them?

Verses 6-10

- When a person is circumcised, a cut is made in the flesh. How would you explain a circumcised heart?
- What will this circumcised heart cause them to do and for how long?
- How will this affect their lives?

Verses 11-14

- On a personal note, these are my uttermost favorite verses in all of God's Word; specifically verse 14!
- His commandments are not too difficult and not out of reach, but where is the word? How far from them? From us? Where specifically?

Verses 15-20

- What choices did He set before them?
- What does He ask them to choose in verse 19?

Deuteronomy 31

Verses 1-6

- What did Moses tell Israel about going with them?
- How old is Moses at this time?
- Who will cross ahead of the people? Aren't you glad to know He goes before us?
- What does verse 6 admonish them to do? Why?

Verses 7-8

- What advice did Moses give Joshua?
- What encouragement did he have for him?

Verses 9-13

- What did Moses write? Do you remember when God told him to do so?
- Note: Moses wrote beginning with Genesis and creation. Job lived well before Moses. That is why we studied Job during Genesis.
- What was the purpose of reading the law in front of all Israel? What is our responsibility to our children?

Verses 14-18

- Why did God want Joshua called to the tent of meeting?
- What did He tell Moses the people would do?
- The passage doesn't say, but how does God know this? Think about it.

Verses 19-22

• What was the purpose of the song?

Verse 23

- Who commissioned Joshua? Moses? Or God?
- What did He say to him?

Verses 24-29

- Where did the Levites place the book Moses had written?
- What was Moses concerned would happen after his death?

Verse 30

• This is a good example of a chapter ending in the middle of the story. Remember, when the Bible was written, it was written without chapter and verse divisions. Those were added later for our ease of use. So, when we are studying, we would do well to remember to keep context by referring back to the last chapter for flow.
