Verses 1-6

- Who is speaking here? If you weren't sure, how would you find out?
- What does Jesus promise in this passage?
- What does Jesus say about Himself?

Verse 7

• What is Jesus claiming in verse 7?

Verses 8-14

• What was Philip's request and how did Jesus respond?

Verse 15

What will we do if we love Jesus?

Verses 16-17

- "Helper" is capitalized here, but if it wasn't, verse 17 would tell us who this is.
- The world doesn't know him, but how do believers know Him?

Verses 18-24

• What does verse 20 mean? Is it about oneness? Do you think the picture of oneness in marriage is the reason Jesus hates divorce and pre-marital sex or sex outside of marriage (fornication), because the picture of oneness becomes skewed?

Verses 25-31

- What will the Helper disciples remember?
- Is there any application for us?
- What kind of peace does Jesus give?
- He told them things ahead of time so that when the things came to pass what would they do?

<u>John 15</u>

Verses 1-11

- What will happen to a branch which doesn't bear fruit?
- What about the branches that bear fruit?
- What does fruit prove? Do you remember Matthew 7?

Verses 12-17

- What does Jesus command in this passage?
- "Friend" is a covenant word. Who laid His life down for those who in covenant are His friends?
- When we get to Romans, we will see that we are free from slavery to the law and slavery to sin.
- Many say they made a choice to follow Jesus. What does verse 16 say about this?
- A true believer will have fruit which remains. When we get to the book of Hebrews, we will see that perseverance is proof of true belief.

Verses 18-25

- Who hates us and Jesus?
- What does this mean if some who hate us are in the church? Just think about this and keep reading.
- If someone rejects us because of our message, who are they actually rejecting?
- According to verse 21, why do they persecute Him? Be specific. Why then do they persecute us?

Verses 26-27

• Where does the Helper come from?

<u>John 16</u>

Verses 1-4

- First, what was the purpose of Him speaking this word?
- Where would they become outcast? What is the application for us?
- What do those who are persecuting us think they are doing?
- But why does verse 3 say they are actually doing so?
- How can having this information encourage believers today?

Verses 5-11

• Why was it to the advantage of the disciples that Jesus went away?

• What is the purpose of the Helper to the world? Of what does He convict them?

Verses 12-15

- Why couldn't Jesus share ALL the information with the disciples at this time?
- Do you think believers could handle it if God gave us a crash course?
- Who will guide us into all truth?
- Who does the Spirit glorify?

Verses 16-22

- Why were the disciples puzzled here?
- Why would the world rejoice when Jesus went away? And why would the disciples grieve?
- What should no one ever take away from us as His disciples?

Verses 23-24

How are we to ask?

Verses 25-28

- Why did He speak in figurative language? What would be the purpose?
- Why does the Father love us?

Verses 29-33

- What will disciples of Jesus have in the world?
- But what does this passage say about Jesus in regard to the world?

<u>Iohn 17</u>

Verses 1-5

• What is the time reference in this passage?

Verses 6-12

- Jesus is praying for His disciples here. They disciples in His day and this High Priestly prayer carries over to us as well.
- What does verse six say about Jesus's mission?

Verses 13-19

- Jesus asked the Father to keep us safe from the evil one in this world. He asks to sanctify us in truth. To sanctify means to set apart for a specific purpose. The sanctification process is the process of being made holy, but God has at times set men apart for his purposes, though they never received Him (example: Cyrus).
- How are we sanctified? In what?

Verses 20-21

• Again, a beautiful picture of oneness.

Verses 22-24

• What is the time reference in the last phrase? We often picture Jesus arriving on the scene as a baby in Luke 2, but Jesus was there in the beginning and there was nothing made that He didn't make (Col 1:16-17, John 1:1-4).
