Matthew 14

Verses 1-2

- The question should come to mind, *At what time?* Matthew 13 leaves us with Jesus's visit to Nazareth. He had been healing and casting out demons.
- Who heard the news about Jesus?
- Who did he think He was? Why should he be concerned about this? Keep reading.

Verses 3-5

- Who had John arrested and why?

Verses 6-12

- Who danced before Herod? What is the relation?
- What did she ask?
- What did he do to John?
- The passage says he was grieved, so why did he go through with it?
- What was reported to Jesus?

Verses 13-14

- Why did Jesus withdraw to a secluded place?

Verses 15-21

- How many people were fed from the five loaves and two fishes?

Verses 22-27

- What happened on fourth watch?

Verses 28-33

- What happened in this passage?

Verses 34-36

- Gennesaret is the Sea of Galilee.
- What happened when the people touched the fringe of His cloak?

Mark 6

- This is Mark's account of what we just saw in Matthew.

Verses 1-6

- Where is it difficult for an audience to receive a teacher?
- Why was He unable to do a miracle there?

Verses 7-13

- Jesus told the disciples to shake the dust off their feet in towns where people didn't receive their message. Had they just witnessed an example of this? Even their teacher was not well received.

Verses 14-16

- What had King Herod heard? This is the next Herod, by the way, not the Herod who had the babies killed when Jesus was born.

Verses 17-29

- Where did his disciples take John's body?

Verses 30-32

- Verse 31 is so important. What does Jesus tell His apostles they needed to do?

Verses 33-44

- What made Jesus feel compassion for the people?
- What did He do before He broke the bread?

Verses 45-46

- What did Jesus do after a long day of ministry?

Verse 47-52

- What had they not gained from watching Jesus expand the meal? Who gives insight?

Verses 53-56

- What did these people want from Jesus?

Luke 9:1-17

Verses 1-6

- What did Jesus give the twelve power and authority over?
- What were they sent out to proclaim? Is there anything else that is acceptable to proclaim?

Verses 7-9

- What are we told here that Herod kept trying to do?

Verses 10-11

- What did the apostles do when they returned?
- Have you ever been in a church service when a returning missionary gave a report?

Verses 12-17

- This is Luke's account of Feeding the 5,000 men, plus women and children.
- Luke's account tells us how Jesus had them divide up and sit together; how did they do it?
- How much food was left? Enough for each disciple to carry a load?
