- Galatians 3:12, "However, the Law is not of faith; on the contrary, "HE WHO PRACTICES THEM SHALL LIVE BY THEM."
- Living by the law makes a man proud. It makes him feel like he's doing something in regard to his salvation, when Jesus finished the work and sat down.
