Psalm 1

Verses 1-6

- What two kinds of people are contrasted in this psalm?
- Notice the progression of the man in verse one.
- What will the man be like who delights in God's law?
- What are the wicked like?
- Where will they not stand?
- What is the end result of the two "ways"?

Psalm 2

Verses 1-12

- Who do the kings and rulers take counsel against?
- Observe verse 7. Is this prophetic? Did you know some psalms contain prophesy?
- How are we to worship the LORD according to verse 11?
- Who is the Son in verse 12? Remember, this is Old Testament.

Psalm 15

Verses 1-5

- What are the characteristics of the person who can abide in His tent or dwell on His holy hill?

Psalm 22

Verses 1-31

- Did you notice that David wrote this psalm (song) for the choir director?
- What is David's question in verse 1? Does God forsake us? Can it feel like He does?
- Who in the New Testament will say these words later? So, is this psalm prophetic?
- How much of this psalm points to Jesus?

Psalm 23

Verses 1-6

- I'm sure you're not familiar with this verse at all.
- Review the kind things God does for us to nurture us.

Psalm 24

Verses 1-10

- How much of the earth belongs to the LORD? Though 1 John tells us the “whole world lies in the power of the evil one”, it belongs to the LORD and Jesus will one day receive the title deed back from this enemy.
- Who is the King of Glory?

Psalm 47

Verses 1-9

- Now that we have looked at the setting up of the choir and singers, do the introductions to these psalms take on more meaning?

Psalm 68

Verses 1-35

- What happened to the earth in verse 8?
- Who sends the rains according to verse 9?
- What is God in verse 19?
- According to verse 32, what should all the earth do?
- Look at verse 35. “Awesome” means “terrible” or “terrifying”.
