Acts 9

Verses 1-9

- Saul had held the coats while the religious men killed Stephen, then he began his campaign against the early church.
- What did he receive from the high priest?
- While Saul was on the road to Damascus, what suddenly flashed around him?

- How were the next three days for Saul?

- What did the Lord tell him to do and how did he respond? Why?

Verses 19b-22

- What did Saul immediately begin to do?
- How did people respond to this message?
- What are we told about him in verse 22?

Verses 23-25

- After a while, what did the Jews plot against Saul?
- How did he escape?

Verses 26-30

- Did the disciples receive Saul right away?
- Who was an encouragement (this is what his name means) to him?
- If you were so inclined, you could print a map and map his journeys as you read. This is how the scholars do it.

Verses 31

- Why was the church enjoying peace at this time?

Verses 32-35

- Which disciple is this passage about?
- What happened to Aeneas and how did this even affect the locals?

Verses 36-43

- Where did Tabitha live and what are we told about her character?
- Who did the Lord use to raise Tabitha?

Acts 10

Verses 1-7

- So far, all the early church believers have been Jewish. Cornelius is a Gentile. What are we told about him?
- What did Cornelius see? What was he told?

Verses 9-16

- What happened to Peter on the next day?
- The Jewish disciple considered Gentiles unclean.

Verses 17-23a

- Of what did the Spirit prepare Peter?

Verses 23b-29

- Why did Peter not allow Cornelius to bow?

Verses 30-33

- What did Cornelius tell Peter?

Verses 34-43

- What did Peter mean by stating that God does not show partiality?
- Can people of any race and every nation come to Jesus for salvation?

Verses 44-48

- Why were the Jewish believers amazed in this passage?
