Isaiah 49

- If you look at the capitalization on the “Me” below, who is Isaiah talking about?

Verse 1

- Matthew 1:21, “And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins.”
- Luke 1:31, “And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name Him Jesus.”

Verses 2-5

- What was the purpose of this “Servant”?

Verse 6

- What will the Servant be to the nations?

Verses 7-9

- If He says “Go forth” to those who are bound, what is He doing for them? Don’t over-think it.

Verses 10-15

- Is it possible for God to forget about Israel?

Verse 16

- I love this verse. In what way did God inscribe us in the palm of His hands? Think about it.

Verses 17-26

Isaiah 50

Verse 1

- There is a teaching that God has divorced Israel and He is finished with her. Romans 11 disputes this as well as other passages which tell us there will always be a remnant. To believe that God is finished with Israel is to believe He broke His covenant with her.

Verses 2-6

- Who is this about? Who does this happen to in the New Testament?

Isaiah 51

Verses 1-2

- Did Abraham go seeking after God?

Verses 3-16

- Where has God put His words?

Verses 17-22

- What does God do for His people?

Isaiah 52

Verse 1

- If this passage says to “awake”, what does it imply the people were doing?

Verses 2-7

- This verse is quoted in Romans 10:15.

Verses 8-12

- In what ways would they NOT go out?

Verse 13

- Again, he is speaking of His Servant.

Verses 14-15

Isaiah 53

- Who is this passage about? How do you know?
