Verses 1-3

- What were the crowds like?
- What was the leaven (sin) of the Pharisees?
- Hypocrisy is living a lie, it's pretending. So, what does this have to do with hidden things being revealed?

Verses 4-7

• To what does He compare sparrows?

Verses 8-12

- Who, in context, was denying Him before men?
- What will cause a man not to be forgiven? Could this be because the Spirit is He who convicts of unbelief?
- What could happen if they confessed Him before men?
- What would they say in defense?

Verses 13-21

- In this passage, a man was being cheated out of his inheritance by a brother. Of what did Jesus say to beware?
- What was the point of the story He told?

Verses 22-32

- He starts this passage with, "For this reason". This answers the question of why. Why do we not need worry about our lives?
- If lost people are eagerly seeking these things, does this imply we don't have faith our God will provide them?
- What are we to seek instead of possessions?

Verses 33-34

 Does Jesus require all His followers to literally sell their possessions to follow Him, or is He, in context, saying if these things are holding us back, we will have a hard time following Him?

What is this passage about?

• The disciples were asking if Jesus was speaking to them or others. What was His answer?

Verses 49-53

- Jesus is known as the Prince of Peace. Did He bring peace?
- The peace He brings is within our hearts.

Verses 54-56

• What did Jesus say about the signs of the times?

Verses 57-59

- What should we try to do before entering court?
- What does this have to do with the context of this passage?

Luke 13

Verses 1-5

- This passage is about a time when Herod came in and killed some while making sacrifice.
- Jesus is saying the violence that happened to them had nothing to do with personal sin.
- Same with those on whom the tower fell.

Verses 6-9

• A true believer will bear fruit.

Verses 10-17

- What caused this woman's illness?
- How long had she been affected?
- How long did it take for Jesus to heal her?
- Why was the synagogue official indignant?
- What did the synagogue official begin to say to the crowd about Jesus?

- What was Jesus's perspective?
- How did the people respond?

Verses 18-21

• We have seen both of these passages before. They are in regard to how the kingdom of God spreads and grows.

Verses 22-30

- What was Jesus doing in the villages on His way to Jerusalem?
- Is the door wide or narrow to salvation?
- What will the argument be from those who didn't enter before the Lord shuts the door?
- What will He say and what will happen to them?

Verses 31-35

- Why would the Pharisees care if Herod wanted to kill Jesus?
- What did Jesus say about Jerusalem?
