2 Chronicles 28

Verses 1-4

- Do you remember the prophets prophesied during the time of this king?
- What was Ahaz like?
- What did he do to his sons? He did this in worship to false gods.

Verses 5-7

- In whose hand did the LORD deliver Ahaz?
- Who had said previously that this would happen?
- What did he carry away? To where?
- To whom else was Judah delivered?
- Why were the 120,000 men in Judah slain?

Verses 8-15

- What did Obed say to Israel?
- What happened to the captives of Judah after this?

Verses 16-21

- Why did Ahaz contact Assyria?
- According to verse 19, why was all this happening?
- How did Ahaz try to buy help from Assyria?

Verses 22-27

- Look at the phrasing in verse 22, “the time of his distress”. Does this remind you of the prophecies?
- Did Ahaz turn to God during this time? To whom did he turn?
- Which doors did Ahaz close?
- The rest of his acts are written in the Book of the Kings below.

2 Kings 16

- This is the parallel passage.

Verses 1-6

- Here we see the word Judean which we will see many times in the New Testament. So, who is a Judean based on this text?

Verses 7-9

- What extra information are we given here regarding what the king of Assyria did to help Ahaz?

Verses 10-16

- What did Ahaz commission Urijah to do?
- Urijah was a priest to the LORD. Should he have done this?
- What was moved from the LORD's house? To do what with?

Verses 17-18

- What else did he do to the house of the LORD?
- Remember, he had locked the doors. There was no sacrifice or worship there.

Verses 19-20

- Who succeeded Ahaz? Do you remember his name from the list at the beginning of Isaiah?

2 Kings 17

Verses 1-4

- Meanwhile, who was ruling in Israel?
- What was he like?
- What was his relationship with Assyria like?

Verses 5-6

- What happened in this passage? The timing is critical.

Verses 7-18

- According to verse 7, why did these things come about for Israel?
- According to verses 15 and 16, what did they reject and forsake?
- What kinds of things did they do which had been strictly forbidden?

Verses 19-20

- Who rejected the descendants of Israel and Judah?

- How did He do this?

Verses 21-23

- Who was the king who started doing evil?
- So, what happened to Israel after she would not turn back to the LORD?

Verses 24-26

- Where were the strangers from who started to settle in Israel?
- What killed some of them in the beginning?

Verses 27-28

- What did the king of Assyria do to remedy this?

Verses 29-33

- What did every nation continue to do?
- Who was supposed to be the light to these nations?
- What did they do according to the customs of their nations?

Verses 24-40

- What do the nations continue to do?
- How does this passage explain this in detail?
