2 Chronicles 19

Verses 1-3

- The first question that should come to mind as you begin this chapter is “Then, when?”. How would you know?
- What was the seer talking about? Do you remember where we left off yesterday?

Verse 4

- What did Jehoshaphat do among the people?

Verses 5-7

- On whose behalf did Jehoshaphat say the judges judged?
- What were they to be careful not to do?

Verses 8-11

- Who did he appoint in Jerusalem?
- How were they to tend to business according to verse 9?
- About what were they to warn the people?

2 Chronicles 20

Verses 1-4

- Now it came about after what?
- Do you remember Moab and Ammon? They are the sons of Lot by his daughters. These are their descendants.
- What are the two things Jehoshaphat did when he was afraid? What is the application for us?

Verses 5-13

- Review the characteristics of God we see from Jehoshaphat’s prayer.
- How many of the people heard this prayer?

Verses 14-17

- What happened to Jahaziel in verse 14?
- What did he do after this happened?
- What did he say?

Verses 18-19

- What did Jehoshaphat and the people do in this passage?

Verses 20-23

- What did Jehoshaphat say to encourage the people?
- Do you recognize what he is quoting in verse 21, even if you don't remember what chapter?
- What happened when they began singing and praising the LORD?
- What happened to their enemies?

Verses 24-25

- What did they do when they saw their enemies' bodies?

Verses 26-30

- What was their attitude like when they returned to Jerusalem?
- How did the nations around them feel about God?

Verses 31-33

- What does this passage say about the timing of Jehoshaphat's reign?
- What does this passage say about his reign?
- In what way did he fall short?

Verses 34-37

- Why would God say Jehoshaphat acted wickedly in allying himself with Ahaziah? Remember, he was the son of wicked Ahab. Think about it.
- Do you remember reading anything about the ships already? Now we have a little more information.

2 Chronicles 21

Verses 1-3

- What happened to Jehoshaphat in this passage?
- Who succeeded him?
- What are we told in verse two?

Verses 4-7

- What did Jehoram do to his brothers? Why do you think he did this?
- How long did he reign?
- What was he like? Were these good or bad men?
- Think about it, Jezebel was his mother-in-law.
- Why did God spare him?

Verses 8-11

- What are we told about Edom in this passage?
- When God says the people “played the harlot”, the picture is that they are cheating on Him with another god, a false god.

Verses 12-15

- What did Elijah prophesy against Jehoram?
- According to verse 15, who would strike the people? Who would send a calamity? What does this tell us about the sovereignty of God?

Verses 16-17

- What did the LORD stir up?
- What did the Philistines do?

Verses 18-20

- Where did Jehoram’s incurable sickness come from?
- Describe how he died.
- How did the people respond to his death?
- Wow, observe verse 20.

2 Chronicles 22

Verses 1-4

- Why did Jehoram’s youngest son succeed him?
- How old was he? How long did he reign?
- What was he like?
- Who encouraged his behavior?

Verses 5-7

- What happened in this passage?

Verses 8-9

- What is said of Jehoshaphat here?
- What is said of Ahaziah?

Verses 10-12

- What did Ahaziah's mother do?
- Who was Jehoshabeath? What did she do?
- Where and for how long was Joash hidden?
- Who ruled during this time?

2 Chronicles 23

Verses 1-7

- What happened in this passage?

Verses 8-11

- Where were David spears and shields?
- Who anointed the king?
- Who do you think the king is?

Verses 12-15

- Remember, Athaliah was ruling.
- What did she say when she realized what was happening?
- What happened to her?

Verses 16-21

- What was the covenant between Jehoiada, the people, and the king?
- Do you think Jehoiada is a hero for restructuring the kingdom according to the word of the LORD and by restoring the kingdom to the rightful heir? Do you think he's a hero for covenanting with the people to serve the LORD?
- What happened in the city when they put evil to death?
