## Ezekiel 5

Verses 1-4

Verses 5-12

- This passage interprets the first passage in this chapter.
- Who would witness the judgments against Israel?
- Yes, the famine was so severe, parents did eat their children and vice-versa.
- What defiled the LORD's sanctuary?

Verses 13-17

- What is used to illustrate the famine?
- What else will happen?

## Ezekiel 6

Verses 1-7

- Remember, Ezekiel is a captive. He is not in Israel when he prophesies.
- What will they know when the slain falls among them?

Verses 8-10

- What will He leave?

Verses 11-14

- What does this passage say they offered to their idols? Do you remember reading about this when God instructed the people regarding the sacrificial system?
- What will they know when this happens?

## Ezekiel 7

Verses 1-4

- This last phrase is a key repeated phrase. What does it say?

Verses 5-9

- What is repeated in this passage?

Verses 10-19

- What does the blowing of the trumpet represent?
- What does it mean that “hands will hang limp” and “knees will become like water”?
- What has their iniquity become?

Verses 20-22

- What is “plunder” and “spoil”? Think pirates.

Verses 23-27

- What will they seek when “anguish” comes?
- What does this passage say about the priest and the prophet?
- What will they know?

## Ezekiel 8

Verses 1-4

- What is the timing of this passage?
- What did the likeness of the man look like?

Verses 5-6

- What idol is mentioned in this passage?

Verses 7-13

- What was in the wall?
- What were the people worshiping as idols?
- Romans 1:25, “For they exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.”

Verses 14-18

- Why would the LORD have no pity and not listen to them? Has He given them plenty of warning and enough chances to repent?
