Luke 22

Verses 1-2

• What do we learn about Passover here?

Verses 3-6

- What are we told about Judas here?
- We were told previously he had already been trying to think of a way to betray Jesus.

Verses 7-13

- What happens on the first day of Passover?
- The city would have been full of pilgrims, therefore difficult to find a place to meet. How did the disciples know where they were to meet?

Verses 14-23

- The old covenant was the law written on stones. What is the new covenant?
- Did any of the disciples know who would betray Jesus?

Verses 24-27

- What do the kings of the Gentiles do?
- Who is greater, the one who reclines at the table or the one who serves?

Verses 28-30

• Who will believers judge?

Verses 31-34

- Who is demanding to sift Peter? If you remember reading through Job, you may remember that the devil can't do anything without the Lord's permission.
- Who was praying for Peter? Do you know He intercedes for us?

Verses 35-38

• What did Jesus tell them to buy with money earned from a coat?

Verses 39-46

- What appeared to Jesus and for what reason?
- What was His sweat like due to His agony? This is a rare medical phenomenon called hematidrosis, or hematohidrosis.
- Are we given any extra information on the reason the disciples fell asleep? If you have ever interceded for anyone, truly interceded, you will know how exhausting it can be.

Verses 47-53

- Did Judas and the chief priests approach Jesus alone and quietly?
- Do you find it interesting Jesus told them to buy swords but then didn't want them to use them?

Verses 54-65

• The men who were accusing Jesus of blasphemy were blaspheming?

Verses 66-71

- This passage begins, "When it was day...", so to reiterate, when was Jesus arrested and questioned?
- How did Jesus respond when questioned?

<u>John 13</u>

Verses 1-4

• If we betray Jesus (as believers we can betray Him with our words or our actions), where does this come from? We need to guard our hearts. It is the seat of our will.

Verses 5-11

• What was the exchange between Jesus and Peter?

Verse 12-20

• We were just told Judas had already made up his mind to betray Jesus. Did Jesus still wash his feet? Would He still lay down His life for Judas, though Judas rejected Him? (Of course, we know Judas will take his own life first).

Verses 21-30

- John was considered the disciple whom Jesus loved. This does not mean He didn't love the others, it just means they had a close relationship.
- What are we told about Judas's communing with Jesus?

- What did Jesus know?
- Why did the disciples think Judas left abruptly?

Verses 31-35

- What is the new commandment? Is it actually new?
- By what will men know we are disciples of Jesus?

Verses 36-38

• What did Peter say he was willing to do for Jesus?
