• What did the man clothed in linen carry with him?

Verses 3-8

- What were the qualifications of the people who received the mark?
- What happened to the people who did not receive the mark?
- Where was this designation begin?
- What is the application for us?

Verses 9-10

• Of what was the city of Jerusalem filled?

Verse 11

- What did the man with the writing case do?
- What is the application for us?

Ezekiel 10

Verses 1-2

- What sapphire object was in the expanse above the cherubim?
- Think back to chapter one. What were the whirling wheels?

Verses 3-5

• What was the cloud and what did it fill?

Verses 6-8

- What did the cherubim have under his wings?
- In our culture, we believe cherub angels are baby angels, but this is not Scriptural. The cherubim are mighty angels. They are mentioned as guarding the entrance to the Garden of Eden and there are cherubim covering the mercy seat on the ark of the covenant.

Verses 9-14

- There is more description of the wheels here. What does it say?
- What happened when they moved?
- What did the four faces resemble?

Verses 15-17

• From this passage, does it seem like the wheels were attached to them or separate?

Verses 18-19

- Did the glory of God hover over the cherubim or beneath them?
- We have been told this twice now. Why do we need to know this?

Verses 20-22

• It's okay if you don't understand some of this. This was a vision of Ezekiel. It was like a dream. He is explaining what he saw. Let the Holy Spirit reveal to you what He will, but it's not necessary to understand every little thing.

Ezekiel 11

Verses 1-4

• What had the leaders of the city done?

Verses 5-12

- What does God know?
- Why were they receiving judgment?

Verse 13

• Pelatiah was a chief leader. His sudden death is a picture that the city would die suddenly and it should have been a warning to the people regarding his false counsel.

Verses 14-21

- Though God had removed them, what would He do in a little while?
- What would they remove from Israel?
- Verse 19 is about the New Covenant. Under the Old Covenant/Old Testament, God's laws were written in stone. Under the New Covenant/New Testament, His laws are written on the hearts of those who believe, or trust in Him.

Verses 22-25

- After Ezekiel's vision, what did he tell the exiles?
- Does the LORD "show" us things through His word? What should we do with this information? Some things He shows us are just for us, some things He shows us are for us to share with others. I would caution; however, receiving a word from someone who says, "God told me to tell you,,,". If the LORD wants you to know something, He will tell you. He may use others to confirm it, but He will show us Himself. Be discerning.

Ezekiel 12

Verses 1-6

- Ezekiel was in exile, but he was amongst his people, God's nation. What does this passage say about them?
- Scripture tells us in 1 Samuel 15:23, that rebellion is the same a witchcraft.
- What does it mean that they have eyes but can not see and ears but can not hear?
- What does Ezekiel's baggage represent? (No, it's not an analogy for our emotional baggage.)

Verse 7

- Did Ezekiel obey God?
- What is our application?

Verses 8-16

- What did the rebellious house ask him?
- Who did the burden represent?
- What would happen to the prince?
- What would they know about the LORD?

• What is the symbolism in this passage?

• What does the LORD declare in this passage?
