

# October 11/Day 284

## Matthew 8:1-13

Verses 1-4

- When we left off yesterday, Jesus was teaching “The Beatitudes” from the Mount of Olives.
- How long did it take for the leper to be healed once Jesus touched him?

Verses 5-13

- What did the centurion tell Jesus about his servant? A centurion is a Roman soldier in a unit of 100 men.
- Why did Jesus tell the centurion he had more faith than anyone in Israel?
- How long did it take for the servant to be healed once Jesus spoke the words?

## Luke 7

Verse 1

- Jesus had been speaking on the Mount of Olives, so the message He gave, including what we call “The Beatitudes”, is part of the Olivet Discourse.

Verses 2-10

- Does this passage from Luke give us additional information regarding the centurion?

Verses 11-17

- Who was doing with him to Nain?
- How did Jesus feel about the widow who lost her only son?
- What did Jesus do for the dead man?
- How did the people feel about this and what did they do and say?

Verses 18-23

- What did John, who was imprisoned, send his followers to ask Jesus when he heard about Jesus’s signs and wonders?
- He had baptized Jesus and witnessed the spirit light upon Him and heard the voice from heaven, so why is he asking this?
- How did Jesus reply?

Verses 24-30

- What things did Jesus say about John I these passages?
- Yet who is greater than John?
- What did the people and tax collectors acknowledge?
- But what did the Pharisees and lawyers do? Remember, these were highly religious men.

Verses 31-35

- By whom is wisdom vindicated? What does this figurative language mean?

Verses 36-39

- Do you think it strange the woman, a sinner, seemed to be comfortable enough to enter the house of this Pharisee?
- What did she bring and what did she do with it?
- What did the Pharisee say?

Verses 40-50

- This Pharisee is named Simon. This is not Simon Peter.
- Describe the parable Jesus tells. What did it represent?
- If we are highly religious and we don't do immoral things, it is hard for us to acknowledge our sin of self-righteousness. He didn't think he had anything for which to be forgiven.
- Who did Jesus say loves more?
- What did He say to the woman?
- Did He say anything similar to the Pharisee?
