• What element of weather is mentioned here? Do you think of this element when you think of this part of the world?

• What had the people done? How many times has God said this now? (You don't have to state a literal number.)

#### Verses 1-9

- We have already seen drought mentioned. Drought brings famine. What does He say will happen to their sons and daughters?

• "Stiffened their necks" means they were stubborn and rebellious.

# <u>Jeremiah 20</u>

#### Verses 1-6

- What was Pashhur's position?
- What did he do to Jeremiah?
- Think about it, the man speaking the words of God was persecuted by a chief religious man.
- What would happen to Passhur?

## Verse 7

- What is Jeremiah's complaint?
- Can you relate to him?

### Verse 8

• Does he receive thanks for his proclamations and warnings?

#### Verse 9

• What happens when Jeremiah considers quitting?

#### Verses 10-11

• Who is with him and what will He cause to happen to those who persecute Jeremiah?

### Verses 12-14

• Why would he feel this way?

Verses 15-18

- Some have said Jeremiah was depressed. Some have called him the "Weeping Prophet".
- Why? Did he have a heavy load? Was he grieved by what he knew? Was he saddened that no one listened? Was he hurt by being persecuted?
- Don't listen to well-meaning Christians who say it's sinful to be depressed. Jeremiah was completely obedient and the LORD used him.
