Micah 1

- Micah is considered a “minor prophet”, not because his message was any less important, but because his book is shorter. There are 12 minor prophets.

Verse 1

- What is the timing of this book? “In the days of...”
- Have we seen these names before? So far, we have seen Isaiah and Amos prophesying during the same time period.
- What is the application for us in regard to there being more than one prophet prophesying at the same time?

- To whom does Micah address his message?

- Why would these things happen?

Verses 6-12

- Where did the calamity originate?
- Where was it going?

- Where would the children be going?

Verses 1-2

- Who is this woe against?

Verse 3

- What kind of time will it be?

Verse 4

- On what day? Is this near future prophecy or far future prophecy?

Verse 5

- Do you remember the plumb line from Amos?

Verses 6-13

- Who goes before the king?

Micah 3

Verse 1

- Who should know justice?

Verses 2-3

- Do you think this is literal or figurative?

Verse 4

- Why will the LORD hide His face from them and refuse to answer their prayers?

Verse 5

- What were the prophets saying to the people that led them astray?

Verses 6-9

- What do the leaders do?

Verses 10-11

- What do these leaders do?

Verse 12

Micah 4

Verse 1

- What is the time reference here?

Verse 2

- Is this near-future or far-future?
- What will the nations say? Are they saying this now?

Verse 3

- What will there be if no one will ever again train for war?

Verses 4-6

- In what day? Remember context.

Verse 7

- What kind of people will be the remnant and strong nation? This is the antithesis of what kind of people?
- What is our application?

Verses 8-10

- Where will they be when they are rescued? So this part of the chapter is a near-reaching prophecy.

Verses 11-13

Micah 5

Verses 1-2

- Who will come forth from Bethlehem?

Verses 3-4

- Who will shepherd the flock?

Verse 5

- Who will be our peace?
- How is this possible if this is the Old Testament and the captivity is Old Testament?

Verse 6

- Do you remember Nimrod from Genesis?

Verses 7-10

- In what day?

Verses 11-12

- Do you remember under the law a person who consulted a medium was to be put to death?

Verse 13

- To what were they bowing? Can this be both literal and figurative?

Verses 14-15

- The law was given to the nation of Israel. According to this, are all nations held to this same standard? If they were not given the law by God, how are they supposed to know it? Think. Through Abraham, all the nations of the world would be blessed.

Micah 6

Verses 1-2

- What does God have against His people?
- He's calling them to court.

Verses 3-8

- What three things does the LORD require?

Verses 9-16

- Do you remember who Omri and Ahab are?

Micah 7

Verse 1

- We have seen “woe” is you, but have we yet seen a “Woe is me”?
- Possibly, when Isaiah said he was undone.

Verses 2-6

- What are these relationships like?

Verses 7-8

- How certain are these words?

Verse 9

- “Pleads my case” and “executes justice”. Remember, He brought them to court, figuratively.

Verses 10-18

- A list of characteristics to add to your systematic theology.

Verses 19-20

- Will God remember His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob?
