Verses 1-10

- All these men are mentioned in regard to genealogy, but we are given more information on one. Who is it?
- What is said of him?
- What did he do?
- What happened with his request?

Verses 11-23

• These are the descendants of Judah.

Verses 24-43

- These are descendants of Simeon.
- Where did these men find good pasture?
- What did they do with the remnant of the Amalekites?

1 Chronicles 5

Verses 1-10

• These are the descendants of Reuben.

- Though he was firstborn, why was his birthright not realized? Do you remember this from Genesis? Who scored the double-portion instead?
- Which river is mentioned here? Have we seen it before? Is it still on the map? Where?
- What did the sons of Reuben do in the days of Saul?

Verses 11-17

- Who did the sons of Gad live opposite?
- In which genealogies were they enrolled? Have we seen this king yet? So, this is a genealogy after the fact. We will get to Jotham.

Verses 18-22

- Why does this passage say the men's prayers were heard in battle?
- What do you think this means that the "war was of God"?

Verses 23-24

• Describe the half-tribe of Manasseh? How many were there? What were they like?

Verses 25-26

- But, how did these men act toward God?
- Who stirred up the spirit of the kings of Assyria against these men?
- Why did He do this?
- What did Assyria do to the tribes of Reuben, Gad, and the half-tribe of Manasseh?
- What is our application?
