Deuteronomy 22

Verses 1-4

- How were they to treat their neighbor's straying livestock?

Verse 5

- This is not about wearing a dress versus pants. Everyone in these days wore robes and tunics. This is about wearing clothes specifically made for men or specifically made for women. It's about cross-dressing.

Verses 6-7

- Describe how the mother bird and her eggs were to be treated.

Verse 8

- This would keep someone from falling off.

Verses 9-12

- These verses are about not mixing materials.

Verses 13-19

- It was a common ploy for a man to wed a virgin, then bring charges against her so she would be stoned to death and he would be free to marry another. The parents of the virgin were given the wedding night sheets to keep as evidence incase her husband tried to claim she was not a virgin when they wed. The parents would use the sheets to prove their daughter's innocence.
