- Is there a danger of forgetting God when our circumstances are positive?
- What happens when we get comfortable?
- What two things did the LORD do to them in the wilderness?
- What was the wilderness like?
- Where does our potential to be successful in our work come from?
- What would happen if they refused to listen to the LORD?

Deuteronomy 9

Verses 1-3

- Do you feel excited for them when you read this? They are finally crossing over the Jordan.
- Who crossed over before the people? In what regard? To do what?

Verses 4-5

- Wow! The promised land is a picture of our salvation and eternal life with God. What were they not to say in their hearts? What is the application for you and me?
- How does the rest of this passage apply to us today?

Verses 6-14

- What did the LORD say the people were like?
- What two things had they done to the LORD?

- What did the tablets of stone represent?
- How were the tablets written?

Verses 15-21

- What did Moses find when he came down from the mountain?
- What did he do with the two tablets?
- What did Moses to for Aaron and the rest of the people?
- What did he do with the calf?

Verses 22-24

• With what is rebellion equated in this passage?

Verses 25-29

- How long did Moses intercede for the people?
- What did he ask the LORD to remember?

Deuteronomy 10

Verses 1-5

- What was written on the second set of tablets?
- Where did he place them?

Verses 6-9

- Who ministered in place of Aaron when he died?
- Which tribe was set apart to carry the ark of the covenant? (By the way, if you want to know why Indy didn't find it in his first movie, we will find out why when we get to Revelation.)

Verses 10-11

• After Moses spent another forty days and nights on the mountain, the LORD relented and told him to proceed where?

Verses 12-22

- What did the LORD require of Israel? What about us?
- What is a circumcised heart? We will see more later, but think about it.
- What does verse 17 say the LORD does not do?
- Why were they to show love to aliens/foreigners?

- Review how verse 20 says God's people are to treat Him.
- What does He say He is in verse 21?
- What does He remind them in verse 22?
