- Who ran to the tomb?

Verses 13-27

- How many were travelling and where were they going?
- Who began walking with them?
- Did they recognize Him? Why or why not?
- What did Cleopas and his companion tell Jesus?
- What did Jesus tell them? How did He begin?

Verses 28-35

- When were their eyes opened? When they communed with him?
- What was happening to them when Jesus was explaining the Scriptures to them?
- To what city did they return? Why?

Verses 36-43

- Who appeared in their midst while the men were telling these things?
- How did they feel about this?
- Do you find it interesting Jesus asked for food?

Verses 44-49

- What must be fulfilled? About whom were the Law and the Prophets written?
- How were their minds opened to understand the Scriptures? Is there any application for us?
- Where did Jesus tell them to stay?

Verses 50-53

• This passage explains what we refer to as the ascension.

What were the disciples continually doing, and where?

<u>John 20</u>

Verses 1-10

- This is John's account.
- Who was with Peter when Mary ran to tell about Jesus? Whose account are we reading?
- Who saw the linen wrappings lying there?
- Where was the face cloth?
- What had they not yet understood?

Verses 11-18

- Why was Mary weeping?
- Did she recognize Jesus at first? When did she recognize Him? Is there any application for us?

Verses 19-23

- What is the time reference here?
- What did Jesus say to the disciples?

Verses 24-25

• Who had a hard time believing this report because he wasn't there at the time?

Verses 26-29

- What is the time reference now?
- When did Thomas believe?
- We give Thomas a hard time, but the other disciples couldn't recognize Him until He allowed them to do so.

Verses 30-31

• I love these verses.

John 21

Verses 1-3

- If you are shipping something by boat or by truck, the paperwork which reveals the inventory in the load is called a "manifest". If Jesus made Himself manifest, this means He made Himself known to them.
- Do you remember another name for the Sea of Tiberias?

Verses 4-8

- What did Jesus cause them to catch?
- When did the disciples recognize Jesus?
- How did they respond to Him?

Verses 9-14

- What time of day was it?
- Personally, I've never had fish for breakfast.
- How many times now had Jesus been made known to the disciples?

Verses 15-17

We may wonder why the Lord asks Peter the same question over and over, but a word study
will help us understand. The first two times, Jesus asks Peter if he loves Him with an agape,
unconditional love and Peter answers that he loves Jesus with a phileo, brotherly love. The
third time, Jesus asks if Peter if he phileos Him, or if he actually has brotherly love for Him.

Verses 18-19

• What did Jesus mean by this word he spoke to Peter?

Verses 20-23

- Who is referred to as the disciples whom Jesus loved? Whose account of the gospel are we reading?
- In verse 22, do you think Jesus is saying "mind your own business"? Who are we to question God's dealings with another?

Verses 24-25

- If we weren't sure, John is saying he is testifying to what he has written here.
- I love verse 25.
