Leviticus 22

Verses 1-9

- Do you remember God said Aaron and his sons would be priests?
- How were they to care for their holy gifts?
- What would happen to a man who profaned a holy gift due to uncleanness?
- How important is purity to the LORD?

Verses 10-16

- A layman is a person who is not a priest.
- How much should be added to make restitution for unintentionally partaking of a holy gift?
- God's name, Jehovah Mekkodishkem, The LORD who sanctifies, is used here.

Verses 17-25

- What does this passage tell us about defective offerings?
- Which offerings are mentioned here?

Verses 26-31

- What two animals are not to be sacrificed on the same day?
- Are the animal sacrifices hard to read about? The price of sin is costly.
- Have you ever heard of a sacrifice of thanksgiving?

Verses 32-33

- Remember, to sanctify means to set apart. God does this. We don't do this. He sets people apart. When He does so, it's not just for the sake of being different, although those who are set apart by God are different, it's for a specific purpose. God may set me apart with a speaking gift, and he may set you apart with a serving gift. His chosen people, Israel, were chosen for a purpose, not just because He saw them and liked them best, but because He chose them to be a kingdom of priests to carry the gospel to the nations.
