- Describe how Ehud defeated Eglon. Did you find this interesting?

Verses 24-25

• How did the servants find Eglon?

Verses 26-30

- Do you think it would be easy to defeat this nation while they were distracted by their leader's death?
- How many years of peace did God give them this time?
- You can make a list of the judges and the time phrases for your records, if you'd like.

Verse 31

- Who was the next judge? Very little is said about him. See chapter 5:6 below.
- In the times prior to Shamgar, all weapons had been seized. He used the only thing he could find as a weapon and killed 600 Philistines with an oxgoad.

Judges 4

Verses 1-3

- What did Israel do after Ehud died?
- What does this mean that the LORD sold them? What was the cost of their idolatry?
- What was the name of the king? Who was his army commander?
- What kinds of resources did they have? What material is mentioned? Remember, this is the beginning of time.
- How long was their servitude to Jabin?

Verses 4-10

- Who was the next judge? What was different about this judge?
- Besides being a judge, what is said of her? What was she? What was her routine?
- Who was her army commander?
- Who did Barak want to go with him?
- Who would receive honor for the battle? Would this woman be Deborah? Keep reading.

Verse 11

• Here we find yet another name for the father-in-law of Moses. He has been called Jethro and Reuel. This could be due to different languages (example: Matthew was also called Levi), or it could be because Moses had married another woman. It is recorded by Josephus that Moses had married a Cushite princess, Tharbis, prior to Zipporah. The way I see it, it doesn't add or take anything away from the text. It's just interesting information.

Verses 12-16

- Who routed Sisera? Remember, he is the enemy!
- Who was pursuing him?
- How many of Sisera's army fell by the sword?

Verses 17-22

• What did Sisera do once his army had been defeated?

- What is the name of the wife in this passage? Her name means "wild goat"! (you will appreciate this!)
- Who was her husband? What was his relationship with Jabin, king of Canaan, the enemy of Israel?
- How did Jael lure Sisera into her tent?
- What does it appear the purpose was of covering him with the rug?
- What was his request? What did she give him instead? Would this have possibly made him feel relaxed?
- What happened once Sisera was sound asleep?
- Would Jael, being a keeper at home, a keeper of the tent, have known how to drive a tent peg?
- Do you remember Deborah's prophecy to Barak? Who was the woman in whose hands Sisera was given? Deborah, a judge and prophetess? Or Jael, a homemaker?
