### Verses 1-9

- Why was Jesus avoiding Judea?
- What is the time reference?
- What do we find out about Jesus's family in verse 3?
- What did His brothers encourage Him to do?
- Was His family supportive of Him?

## Verses 10-13

- Did Jesus end up going to the feast? How?
- What was being said of Him?

#### Verses 14-18

- What did Jesus do in the temple?
- How did Jesus respond to those who said He was uneducated?

#### Verses 19-24

- The crowd accused Him of being paranoid when He asked why they sought to kill Him, but we have seen where the Pharisees were planning to kill Him, and ultimately did.
- How are we to judge?

## Verses 25-31

- What did the people in verse 25 say? So, was Jesus paranoid? Or, were the accusations a cover-up?
- Why didn't anyone lay hands on Him while He was publicly in the temple? One reason is because He had many followers and they were scared of the crowds, what is another reason according to this text?
- What did many in the crowd do?

## Verses 32-36

- What did the chief priests and Pharisees send officers to do?
- What did Jesus say that baffled them?

#### Verses 37-39

- What did Jesus say on the last day of the feast?
- What does this mean?

#### Verses 40-44

- Christ is the Greek equivalent of Messiah.
- Why was there a division regarding Jesus?
- Is there any application for us?

#### Verses 45-53

- Why didn't the officers bring Jesus to the Pharisees?
- Do you remember Nicodemus from John chapter three?

## John 8

## Verses 1-11

- Notice, the bracketed text begins in the last chapter.
- Where did they place the woman caught in adultery? Why do you think they placed here there?
- What did the law of Moses command to be done to an adulteress? And why was it important to note she was caught in the act?
- Why were they asking Jesus about this?
- Are we told what Jesus was writing on the ground?
- How did He answer the men and what did they do when they received an answer?
- Jesus, who has the right to condemn, did not condemn the woman, but what did He say to her?

#### Verses 12-20

- What did Jesus say He was and how does this affect those who follow Him?
- This time the Pharisees call Him a liar.
- What did He say to them about knowing God, the Father?
- Again, we see why He was not yet arrested.

## Verses 21-30

- Did these men understand at all what Jesus was talking about? What did they think He was saying?
- What must be believed to save them from dying in their sins?
- Of whom did they not realize He was speaking?

• What are some of the things He was saying about the Father?

#### Verses 31-33

- What will true disciples do?
- If there are true disciples, does this mean there are false disciples? (Judas?)
- What sets a person free?
- Did these men understand what He was saying?

#### Verses 34-38

- So, what kind of slavery was Jesus talking about, physical or spiritual?
- Does the son have the authority to set someone free?
- If the son sets us free, what is our freedom like?
- Why does the text say the religious people sought to kill Him?

## Verses 39-47

- What had Jesus told them that caused them to want to kill Him?
- Is there any application in this for us?
- If God was actually the Father of these religious men, what would they do?
- Who does Jesus say is their father? But, these are the religious leaders, how can this be?
- What was the devil from the beginning? Did we see this in the beginning, in Genesis?

## Verses 48-59

- What did Jesus finally say in regard to being demon possessed?
- Can people still be demon-possessed today?
- What was their argument in this passage?
- Is Jesus talking about physical death or spiritual death?
- Wow, did Jesus just call someone a liar?
- What did Jesus say in verse 58? "I AM" is the covenant name of God, YHWH, or Yahweh. So, what was Jesus saying that caused them to pick up stones to kill Him?
