Verses 1-2

• Our salvation is in God's timing. We saw this in Galatians chapter one.

Verses 3-10

• In what ways will we be commended as servants of God? (All the items listed after "in")

- How? (All the items listed after "by")
- How will we be known? (All the items listed after "as")

Verses 11-13

• Did Paul hide anything or hold anything back from the Corinthians?

Verses 14-15

• We usually hear verse 14 quoted in regard to marriage, but while it is a good practice, this verse is not in the context of marriage. The context is in general.

Verses 16-18

- Where will God dwell? Walk?
- What shall we be to Him?

2 Corinthians 7

Verse 1

• "Therefore" is a term of conclusion. Remember, chapter and verse division are man-made and were added so that we can easily find our way around Scripture. When the Scriptures were written, they were not divided up. This "therefore" is concluding what was said in the last chapter. What is it concluding?

Verses 2-4

• Was everyone thrilled with the message Paul was giving?

Verses 5-16

- According to verse 5, what did Paul experience from other? From within himself?
- Whom does God comfort, according to verse 6? What does this tell us about Paul?
- What had Paul's first letter caused?
- Did this cause him to feel regret for sending it? Why or why not?
- Why did he rejoice about their sorrow?
- What does the sorrow according to the will of God (godly sorrow) produce?
- What does the sorrow according to the world (regret) produce?
- How was Titus received?

2 Corinthians 8

• How did the churches in Macedonia give?

Verses 7-15

- What is the paradox in verse 9?
- Out of one's abundance a need is supplied. This is the work of the church, not the government.

Verses 16-24

• What information is given in this passage about Titus?

2 Corinthians 9

Verses 1-5

• Superfluous means more than enough.

Verses 6-9

- What is the contrast between the sowings?
- What does God love?

Verses 10-15

• What does this passage detail in regard to giving to ministry?
