Deuteronomy 11

Verses 1-7

- What was the purpose of saying He wasn't speaking to their sons?
- Whose eyes had witnessed His great work?

Verses 8-12

- How many of God's commandments were they expected to keep?

Verses 13-17

- What will happen if they listen and obey?
- What will happen if they become deceived and worship other gods? Notice the two go hand in hand; deception and idolatry.

Verses 18-25

- Verse 18 is part of the Shema we saw in chapter 6, and the reason Jewish men wear the phylacteries.
- In the passage above, the instructions were given to the adults, those who had witnessed God's works. Whose responsibility is it to share this information with the children?
- While Jewish families literally attach these words to their doorposts with mezuzahs, in what way can the commandments of God be used figuratively on our doorposts? Just a thought.
- How will God take care of their enemies if they walk in His statutes?

Verses 26-28

- So, blessings are conditional; so are curses.

Verses 29-32

- What were they about to do?

Deuteronomy 12

Verses 1-7

- God has said multiple times, the people are to be "careful" to observe His statutes. We live under grace, so what does this mean for us?
- What were they to utterly destroy? What is the application for us?

- How were they NOT to act toward God? Keep context.

Verses 8-12

- Should every man do what is right in his own eyes?
- What is the “then” for in verse 11?

Verse 13

- Where were they NOT to offer their burnt offerings?
- Where WERE they to offer their burnt offerings?

Verses 15-19

- What part of the meat were they NOT to eat?
- Who were they to be careful not to forsake?

Verses 20-27

- What does verse 23 remind us about the blood? (Leviticus 17:11,14)

Verse 28

- How would things go well for them?

Verses 29-31

- What does this last phrase say the other nations were doing to their own children as sacrifice to their gods?

Verse 32

- What is someone wants to change God’s commandments?

Deuteronomy 13

Verses 1-5

- How does God use a situation when a prophet or dreamer tells the people to follow after other gods?
- What will happen to this person? Why?

Verses 6-11

- I thought this was sweet what He says about the wife. Should a man listen to her if she tries to entice Him to follow another god?
- And look what He says about this friend. Should a man listen to him?
- What was to be done to them instead? Does this seem harsh? Then, why?

Verses 12-18

- What should happen to the city that follows after another god?
- Could they keep the booty? Why or why not?
