Isaiah 20

Verses 1-6

- What two time references are used in verse one?
- What did Isaiah wear for three years?
- What did his attire, or lack thereof, represent?

Isaiah 21

Verses 1-2

- The Medes and Persians will overtake Babylon.

Verses 3-10

- This message was against Babylon.

Verses 11-17

- These messages are against Edom and Arabia.

Isaiah 22

Verse 1

- Jerusalem is the valley of vision.

Verses 2-3

- Did you notice these verses are past tense?

Verses 4-5

- What does the LORD of hosts/commander of the heavenly armies have?

Verses 6-11

- Who made it and planned it? When?

Verse 12

- Therefore is a term of conclusion. So, because they did not consider God, what happened?

Verses 13-20

- Eliakim was a member of Hezekiah's cabinet. Eliakim means "resurrection of God".

Verses 21-25
