• Have you read these words before? If so, where?

Verses 12-13

• What will return to the waste place?

Verses 14-18

- What is the time reference here?
- Who is this about?
- The name for God here is Jehovah Tsidkenu, "The LORD is our righteousness". There is no way we can be righteous apart from receiving Jesus and the indwelling of God's spirit. Notice, He is our righteousness, we are not.

Verses 19-22

- When would God break His covenant with David?
- What was the covenant with David about?

Verses 23-26

• What would He do with them instead of breaking the covenant?

Jeremiah 34

Verses 1-5

- What was the timing of this word?
- What would Nebuchadnezzar do with the city?

Verses 6-11

- What would the people do with their servants in order to not keep a fellow Jew in bondage?
- Did you notice the word "Jew" was mentioned here? It comes from the word "Judah".

Verses 12-22

• Passing between parts of the calf is a reference to cutting covenant. A covenant is so serious it is as if to say, "may this happen to me (slaughter of the animal for blood covenant) if I break this covenant".
